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## Warnings

## General

- Do not use any sharp tools to open the packaging.
- We strongly advise against using power tools.
- Tripping hazard, mind your step.
- Do not put out cigarettes on the sofa.
- Not grafitti proof.
- Do not leave children unattended whilst playing on the sofa.
- To avoid danger of suffocation, keep plastic bags away from babies and children.
- Colors can differ over years and from batch to batch.

## Product

- We strongly advise storing the blanket & cushions indoors when the Walrus is not used frequently.
- Do not leave iron items such as needles, knives or tools to close to the magnets of the back cushions.
- People with a pacemaker should not come into contact with the magnetic field.
- Keep electrical equipment and data cards away from the magnetic field.
- Keep the magnets away from open flames and heat.
- In order to open and close the storage pouch, the Walrus should be at least 50 cm away from obstacles such as a wall, fence, pool, etc.
- The Walrus is not a toy. Kids and pets don't belong in the storage pouch!
- The Walrus is only compatible with Extremis cushions and blankets.
- Do not stand on the seat and do not lie down on the sofa with your shoes on.
- Keep pets and sharp objects away from the Walrus to avoid damaging the fabric.
- Jeans can leave dye marks on the Walrus tarpaulin, just as they can on other seating fabrics.

• Max. 2 people or 160 kg per module.

## Tarpaulin

- We advise cleaning frequently.
- Clean the fabric regularly, don't forget to clean between the cushions, to prevent lasting stains.
- Keep in mind that white is a more sensitive color.
- UV color fastness: 7/8 (ISO 105-B02)
- Flame retarding: Flame speed <100mm/sec ISO3795 1989.
- Leaves that are not swept off the seat promptly may start fermenting and cause stubborn stains. This is why we highly recommend that you do not put your furniture under a tree.
- Cushions in darker colors can get very hot in the sun. Be aware.

## Galvanized steel

- Galvanization will become less shiny when used outdoors.
- Flame retarding NEN-EN13501-1 A1 Class A1 products will not contribute to fire in any stage, including fully developed fire. For this reason, they are assumed to be capable of satisfying all requirements of all lower classes as well.
- Possible impurities in the immersion tank can cause black marks during galvanization, which are intrinsic to this industrial finishing technique.
- White marks on this zinc layer are also intrinsic to this procedure and will disappear when the furniture is put outdoors.
- This industrial finishing technique may result in a rougher surface. This is intrinsic to the process.

## Fiberglass

• Wear gloves when assembling or dismantling the fiberglass rods. They can cause skin irritations.

## Sunbrella

- Not waterproof, store inside!
- Shake or brush off loose dirt immediately.
- UV color fasteness: 7/8 (ISO 105-B02).

## Wood

- When delivered, the wood is untreated.
- Wood is a natural material and its look is different for every slat, plank and tree.
- Wood will gradually become rougher and start to turn grey as a consequence of exposure to the sun and rain. We recommend oiling the wood once or twice a year. 1x before the Summer and 1x after the Summer as protection for the Winter.
- Cleaning regularly with mild detergent. Never use a high pressure cleaner as this will roughen the wood's smooth surface and irreparably damage the wood's fibress.
- Thorough cleaning with Extremis Wood Cleaner.
- We strongly recommend that you treat your wood with wood oil to protect it from stains - Small cracks and crevices can also appear as part of this process. We strongly advise everyone to treat the furniture with our Wood Protector. It is best to repeat this treatment each year.

## Assembly text instructions

## Club chair 110 (p13)

- 1. Place the frame on two trestles, with the rods facing upwards so that you can reach the underside more easily.
- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 3. Position the backrest in the middle of the back of the frame (the side with no rods). Make sure the storage pouch is facing outwards.
- 4. Push three M8x20 bolts, each with one M8 spring washer on them, through the underside of the frame so that they come out in the storage pouch of the back cushion and attach them with an M8 cap nut and M8 flat washer. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!
- 5. Now attach both armrests to the frame using three M8x20 bolts and M8 spring washers per armrest. <u>Tip</u>: First position the bolt in the front, then the one in the back and finally the center bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 6. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Club chair 80 (p18)

- 1. Place the frame on two trestles, with the rods facing upwards so that you can reach the underside more easily.
- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!

- 3. Remove the rods on both sides of the frame.
- 4. Position the backrest in the middle of the back of the frame (the side with no rods). Make sure the storage pouch is facing outwards.
- 5. Push three M8x20 bolts, each with one M8 spring washer on them, through the underside of the frame so that they come out in the storage pouch of the back cushion and attach them with an M8 cap nut and M8 flat washer. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!
- 6. Now attach both armrests to the frame using three M8x20 bolts and M8 spring washers per armrest. <u>Tip</u>: First position the bolt in the front, then the one in the back and finally the center bolt. <u>Tighten all</u> <u>bolts</u>!
- 7. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Corner seat 110/80 (p24/31)

- 1. Place the frame on two trestles, with the rods facing upwards so that you can reach the underside more easily.
- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 3. Remove the rod on the side where you want to fit the armrest.
- 4. Choose if you want a left or right corner seat. Position the backrest off center on the back of the frame (the side with no rods) as shown on the diagram. Make sure the storage pouch is facing outwards.
- 5. Push three M8x20 bolts, each with one M8 spring washer on them, through the underside of the frame so that they come out in the storage pouch of the back cushion and attach them with an M8 cap nut and M8 flat washer. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!
- 6. Now attach the armrest to the frame using three M8x20 bolts and M8 spring washers. <u>Tip</u>: First position the bolt in the front, then the one in the back and finally the center bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 7. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Middle seat 110 (p36)

- 1. Place the frame on two trestles, with the rods facing upwards so that you can reach the underside more easily.
- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 3. Position the backrest in the middle of the back of the frame (the side with no rods). Make sure the storage pouch is facing outwards.
- 4. Push three M8x20 bolts, each with one M8 spring washer on them, through the underside of the frame so that they come out in the storage pouch of the back cushion and attach them with an M8 cap nut and M8 flat washer. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 5. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Middle seat 80 (p40)

- 1. Place the frame on two trestles, with the rods facing upwards so that you can reach the underside more easily.
- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 3. Remove the rod on the side where you want to fit the backrest.
- 4. Position the backrest in the middle of the back of the frame (the side with no rod). Make sure the storage pouch is facing outwards.
- 5. Push three M8x20 bolts, each with one M8 spring washer on them, through the underside of the frame so that they come out in the storage pouch of the back cushion and attach them with an M8 cap nut and M8 flat washer. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 6. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Seat with side table 110/80 (p45/51)

1. Place the frame on two trestles, with the rods facing upwards so that you can reach the underside more easily.



- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 3. Remove the rod on the side where you want to fit the side table.
- 4. Choose if you want the side table on the left or right. Position the backrest off center on the back of the frame (the side with no rods) as shown on the diagram. Make sure the storage pouch is facing outwards.
- 5. Push three M8x20 bolts, each with one M8 spring washer on them, through the underside of the frame so that they come out in the storage pouch of the back cushion and attach them with an M8 cap nut and M8 flat washer. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!
- 6. Now attach the side table to the frame using four M8x12 bolts and M8 spring washers. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 7. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Corner seat with side table 110 (p57)

- 1. Place the frame on two trestles, with the rods facing upwards so that you can reach the underside more easily.
- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 3. Position the backrest in the middle of the back of the frame (the side with no rods). Make sure the storage pouch is facing outwards.
- 4. Push three M8x20 bolts, each with one M8 spring washer on them, through the underside of the frame so that they come out in the storage pouch of the back cushion and attach them with an M8 cap nut and M8 flat washer. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!
- 5. Choose if you want a left or right corner seat. Attach the armrest to the frame using three M8x20 bolts and M8 spring washers. <u>Tip</u>: First position the bolt in the front, then the one in the back and finally the center bolt. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!
- 6. Now attach the side table to the frame using four M8x12 bolts and M8 spring washers. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!

7. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Corner seat with side table 80 (p63)

- 1. Place the frame on two trestles, with the rods facing upwards so that you can reach the underside more easily.
- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 3. Remove the rods on both sides of the frame.
- 4. Position the backrest in the middle of the back of the frame (the side with no rods). Make sure the storage pouch is facing outwards.
- 5. Push three M8x20 bolts, each with one M8 spring washer on them, through the underside of the frame so that they come out in the storage pouch of the back cushion and attach them with an M8 cap nut and M8 flat washer. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!
- 6. Choose if you want a left or right corner seat. Attach the armrest to the frame using three M8x20 bolts and M8 spring washers. <u>Tip</u>: First position the bolt in the front, then the one in the back and finally the center bolt. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!
- 7. Now attach the side table to the frame using four M8x12 bolts and M8 spring washers. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 8. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Seat with 2 side tables 110 (p70)

- 1. Place the frame on two trestles, with the rods facing upwards so that you can reach the underside more easily.
- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 3. Position the backrest in the middle of the back of the frame (the side with no rods). Make sure the storage pouch is facing outwards.
- 4. Push three M8x20 bolts, each with one M8 spring washer on them, through the underside of the frame so that they come out in the

storage pouch of the back cushion and attach them with an M8 cap nut and M8 flat washer. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!

- 5. Now attach both side tables to the frame using four M8x12 bolts and M8 spring washers per side table. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 6. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Seat with 2 side tables 80 (p75)

- 1. Place the frame on two trestles, with the rods facing upwards so that you can reach the underside more easily.
- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 3. Remove the rods on both sides of the frame.
- 4. Position the backrest in the middle of the back of the frame (the side with no rods). Make sure the storage pouch is facing outwards.
- 5. Push three M8x20 bolts, each with one M8 spring washer on them, through the underside of the frame so that they come out in the storage pouch of the back cushion and attach them with an M8 cap nut and M8 flat washer. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!
- Now attach both side tables to the frame using four M8x12 bolts and M8 spring washers per side table. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 7. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Footstool (p83)

- 1. Place the frame on two trestles, with the rods facing upwards so that you can reach the underside more easily.
- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!
- 3. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Connection piece (p85)

1. Place the modules in the correct position in the definitive place where you intend to use the sofa. Place the modules side by side and align them as well as possible.

a. Hold the base of the connection piece underneath the two frames, level with the holes intended for attaching the connection piece. Lay the upper plate on top of the frames, also level with the holes.
b. Now fix the connection piece using two M8x45 bolts and M8 nuts

#### as shown in the diagram. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!

## Coffee & corner square table (p86)

- 1. Put the tabletop upside down on a soft surface with the frame facing upwards.
- 2. Attach the four feet to each corner of the frame with an M10x20 bolt. <u>Tighten all bolts</u>!

## Linking table (p87)

1. Place the modules +/-55 cm apart.

a. Remove the cap nut & flat washer on the inside of the storage pouch (on the side where you want to attach the linking table).
b. Now also remove the bolt & spring washer from the bottom side of each backrest. Keep all washers and cap nuts!

- 2. Place the linking table in between the two modules. First attach the linking table to the frames using four M8x45 bolts & M8 nuts.
- 3. Now push one M8x40 bolt with one M8 spring washer (per backrest), through the underside of the frame so that it comes out in the storage pouch of the back cushion and attach them with the M8 cap nut and M8 flat washer. <u>Tighten the bolts</u>!
- 4. Finally place the seating cushion on the frame and fix it in place by attaching the Velcro straps to the two rods in the middle.

## Tarpaulin CLEANING SPILLED LIQUIDS IMMEDIATELY

#### Regularly and after every use

We advise you to clean the sofa regularly to avoid dirt to pile up. Never allow stains to soak into the tarpaulin. Soak up anything likely to cause a stain immediately with a soft, clean cloth or sponge. (Never use the scouring side of the sponge). Never rub too hard and be sure not to use abrasive cleaning products. This can damage the protective coating which will lead to the tarpaulin absorbing dirt more quickly. Do not only treat the dirty spot, but the surrounding area of the tarpaulin as well.

#### THOROUGH CLEANING

#### When dirty

Use an Extremis brush and Extremis multi cleaner, a 100% biodegradable detergent, or detergents you also use to clean your kitchen. What if the stain has still not completely disappeared after you have done this? Don't panic. The stain will fade away almost completely in the sunlight.

## **REMOVING STAINS**

When dirty

For black stains on the Walrus, we recommend using MSR Stain Remover. Wear gloves!

## Galvanized steel

CLEANING When dirty Clean with lukewarm water and a brush.

## REPARING DAMAGED PARTS WITH ZINC SPRAY

<u>When damaged</u>

Hot dip galvanization is the most durable way of protecting metal against rusting. If the zinc coating is damaged, the exposed metal can rust. This can easily be touched up with zinc paint that automatically has the same colour and is readily available in shops. Zinc spray forms a quick drying, self healing and flexible coating that helps stop corrosion.

## Fiberglass

### CLEANING

#### Once in a while

The fiberglass rods do not require special maintenance. They can simply be kept dustfree with a slightly damp cloth.

## USEFULL ADVICE

When you disassemble the Sticks space divider, bundle the rods with the same side up or down, as the base sometimes leaves marks on the rods. When re-inserting the rods in the base, make sure they are facing the same way as they did before the disassembly.

#### Sunbrella

## SPILLED LIQUIDS

Immediately after use

It is best to treat spilt liquids immediately by placing a sheet of absorbent kitchen paper on them. The water-resistant coating on the Sunbrella



prevents droplets from penetrating the fabric.

#### REGULAR CLEANING <u>When dirty</u> Make a solution to remove stains on your Sunbrella.

## MACHINE WASHING

#### <u>Rarely</u>

It is also possible to put the blankets and cushion covers in a washing machine (30°). Do not dry clean or tumble dry. The fabric can be creased. Ironing will help to recover the waterrepellent coating of the fabric, but only at a cool setting (delicates). As some irons exceed the recommended temperature at the synthetic setting, test a small, inconspicuous area before ironing the entire fabric. DO NOT use a steamer or iron set to the steam setting.

If the cushion has metal brackets, we recommend turning the cover inside out first to avoid damaging the washing machine. In this case, leave the zipper open about 10 cm.

## **REMOVING STUBBORN STAINS**

#### Only if nothing else helps

More drastic measures needed? Bleach can be used if nothing else helps. Protect the area around your Sunbrella fabric when using a bleach solution – bleach may discolour non-Sunbrella fabrics.Please be aware of the environment when cleaning with bleach. Bleach can have harmful effects on the natural environment around you. We do not advise using bleach if you are surrounded by a body of water or another environment that could be affected. If stains and/or mildew marks are severe, the quantity of bleach may be increased.

## Wood

#### OILING

<u>Twice a year</u>

Before first use and/or after cleaning and sanding, we strongly recommend treating the wood with Extremis Wood Protector to protect it from dirt, moisture and UV rays.

## DAY TO DAY CLEANING

#### Regularly and after every use

Schedule regular maintenance to prolong the life of your garden furniture Regular maintenance ensures that the furniture always looks its best.

Cleaning the wood regularly and immediately after use with a clean, damp cloth ensures that liquids cannot penetrate deep into the wood. A well oiled table is less likely to absorb liquids and thus stays cleaner for longer. To remove stubborn dirt, simply use a hard brush and some water. Be careful not to cause permanent damage to the fibres. For this reason, you should never, ever use a high-pressure washer for cleaning wood.

## THOROUGH CLEANING

#### <u>Twice a year</u>

It is essential to clean the wood thoroughly twice a year. We recommend doing this just before spring and after summer if your furniture is outside all the year round. Pick one of those humid, cloudy days, as it is better for the moisture level in the wood to dry out slowly after cleaning.

## SANDING WOOD

#### Every 2 years

After a few years, your wood will show cracks and perhaps some distortion. This is perfectly normal as wood is a natural and living material. The great advantage of solid wood is that you can sand away the top layer to make the surface even and smooth again. You should do this every two years using a hand sanding machine. Choose a dry day. Finish off with a 120-grit sandpaper.

## **REPLACING A WOODEN PART**

Hey! You don't need to be an engineer to understand our products. And you don't even need to be great at DIY to replace a part. Do make sure that you can't repair the damage simply by sanding the slat.
